Legal Work : Email from Clarkson Hirst : I have written to the Environment Agency.

I note that the deed they prepared does not include reference to your legal title.

I am asking if they have obtained this from the Land Registry and I will come back to you thereafter. In the meantime with regard to the grantees covenants these are listed in paragraph 5 of the document. Whilst there is a covenant to repair damage you may want them to contribute to the cost of resurfacing or indeed resurface on a periodic basis if their use is a continuous and causing damage. Please could you come back to me on this point.

The tree planting at the War Memorial needs to:

- Be as resistant to Honey Fungus as possible. Certain trees are more susceptible than others; although all plants can be affected. The plants noted below have had limited recorded impact from Honey Fungus. Please note that this does not mean that all species of oak, Beech etc are the same - some have been recorded as highly susceptible to the fungus;

- The tree should not have a maximum height of over 15m height due to local buildings;

- Autumn interest would be appropriate;

- Hardy;

- Be fairly 'tidy' in shape due to its location within the memorial gardens.

The planting could be one tree or if a Fastigiata (columnar) then three could be positioned behind the memorial.

I also thought a nod to a traditional English tree may be appropriate for the site so I have also included an oak etc.

Options:

Quercus Crimson Spire - Oak Columnar with vivid red in Autumn. Maximum height 15m by 6m width. Fagus Sylvatica "Red Obelisk' - Copper Beech compact with purple foliage. Maximum 10m by 3m. 3 could be located in the space.

Cercidiphyllum Japonicum 'Pendulum'. Weeping habit with Autumn colour and scent. Maximum 10m by 10m.

Cercidiphyllum Japonicum - Katsura tree. Heart shaped leaves with Autumn colour and some scent. Maximum 15m by 10m.

Carpinus Betulus Frans Fontaine. Hornbeam with columnar habit turning yellow in Autumn. Maximum 15m by 3m.
