14/105 COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

The Crook O'Lune Bridge has been reopened after its renovation. It was agreed that a good job had been done and we looked forward to seeing the site reinstatement completed.

Lancashire County Council had put forward proposals to withdraw the subsidies on all evening and Sunday bus services. This would probably mean the end of these services which would hit young people hard and isolate the communities up and down the Lune Valley. The consultation period ends on Friday 14th January and it was agreed that the Council send a letter of objection. The withdrawal of services would have a devastating effect on the lives of people in the rural community, effecting jobs, entertainment and hospital visiting.

14/106 LENGTHSMAN, HIGHWAYS & FOOTPATHS

The Lengthsman has confirmed that he will be retiring in March. There were no plans to replace him and the jobs performed by him would be covered on an ad hoc basis out of the revenue budget.

Ivy overgrowing on the side of the wall at Willow Mill would be reported to Highways. The problems with erosion at Bull Beck would be reported.

14/108 DRAFT BUDGET

The draft Budget was discussed. There was general agreement but a final decision would be made next month for the Precept.

14/109 HORNBY ROAD CAR PARK

The wording of the proposed Agreement was discussed and changed. The Agreement would be circulated to Councillors prior to being sent to the Co-op. Only after the Agreement had been signed by both parties would the trial delivery system start. Once in force a notice would be placed in the Link informing residents of what was going on.

14/110 MOOR PLATT

Demolition starts this week or next.

They are considering replacing the Bus shelter outside the Institute and it was agreed that the 'Chester' from Queensbury Shelters be considered for the new one. This is very similar to the one in Hornby. Concern was expressed that there should be no reduction in the number of car parking spaces outside the Institute. An alternative site for the existing shelter could not be found and it was agreed that this could be scrapped.

14/111 STATION ROAD CAR PARK

Quotes for the resurfacing of the car park had been obtained. A decision was postponed until one had been received from the County Council. The Clerk was asked to find out how soon the work could be done and how weather dependant it was.

14/112 WAR MEMORIAL

Advice has been sought from the War Memorials Trust regarding the best methods of cleaning the Memorial. Grants are available for Conservation but not maintenance and would be looked into.
