## 12/220 COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

It was reported that the prospective purchasers of the Moor Platt site had been unable to raise the necessary finance but were still interested. It has gone back on the market.

Also it was stated that the County Council had agreed that the Hornby Road car park would continue to be leased to the Parish Council. Confirmation of this in writing was requested.

The Storey Institute is in severe financial difficulties. The City Council will not support it financially and the management committee is in liquidation. It maybe that the tenants will run it themselves.

The Market closed mid September and negotiations are ongoing to buy out the remaining lease. The Centros development is being rethought with the main focus on maintaining the 'Town Centre'. There is a desire to improve the Street Markets and create more pitches (moving into side streets).

#### 12/221 LENGTHSMAN, HIGHWAYS & FOOTPATHS

The Lengthsman contract was signed and clarification was given of the scope of Lancashire County Council PROW work. The £200 payment covered annual strimming work and other maintenance work would be offered to the Parish Council (Lengthsman) first. We could agree to do the work at the County rate or refuse it and then County would engage other contractors. Trees and Planters on Sycamore Road continue to be a problem. We would consult with LCC and shopkeepers and investigate the costs of removing them.

The ownership of the land recently fenced off at Crossing Keepers Cottage will be investigated with LCC.

The state of the road to the Wind Farm was discussed. It would be reported to LCC, with reference to the problems of reinstatement after the construction of the wind farm. There are now new owners who may be prepared to help.

Problems with trees on Quarry Road and surface water issues at the new 'cyclist holding area' on Hornby Road would be reported.

#### 12/222 AUDIT

The Audit was completed successfully on 1<sup>st</sup> Aug with no matters to report which affected the Auditor's opinion however it was highlighted that the outstanding borrowing figure was understated. This has been corrected.

It was **resolved** to accept the Audited accounts.

The Clerk was asked to write and thank Mrs Creswell for undertaking the Internal Audit and send a bunch of flowers.
