#### LUNE VALLEY SWIFT GROUP

Its May at last, the month that sees our Swifts return after a 6000-mile flight from southern Africa. Keep an eye out for their high-speed aerobatics where insects are plentiful, such as along the river. We'll soon also see them flying low around buildings, staking their claims for nest sites once again.

As many of their nest sites have been lost, installing nest boxes is one of the best ways you can help our Swifts, and there are a few golden rules for doing so: boxes should be on east or north facing walls (or elsewhere if in shade all day) to avoid chicks dying from overheating; and they need to be a minimum of 4-metres above the ground with a clear flyway in front -no obstacles such trees or buildings close by.

We meet at 19.30 every second Weds of the month in the Station pub, and over the summer we will continue to survey breeding Swifts and provide advice to home-owners on how to protect existing nest sites or install boxes. #### CATON ST PAUL'S C of E PRIMARY SCHOOL

The highlight of our month has been a Mother's day breakfast in school where we welcomed around 115 mums and grandmas for bacon sandwiches and a coffee. It was lovely to see the school hall so full and vibrant as we continue to welcome our community into school to share in special occasions. We also enjoyed celebrating Easter at St Paul's church with all classes taking part in a wonderful service. Revered Helen led the service and we have also welcomed her into school to lead worship, as well as Brookhouse Community Church and Caton Baptist Church. We also unveiled the Big frieze which could be seen in Church over easter and is now on display in our school - each class worked creatively to produce a lovely section of the Big Frieze and learn more about the Bible.

Our choir sang beautifully at the Lancaster singing festival in the Town Hall. It was lovely to see so many children from so many schools singing their hearts out for a full audience. Our choir is made up of our KS2 children and they have sung all around the local area this year.

Amethyst class have completed the Facing the Past slave trade tour of Lancaster. it's really important we understand our past to be able to improve our future and these children found out lots of fascinating information about Lancaster's slaving past.

Our PTA continue to be incredibly busy raising money to help with the education of our children. The school disco was attended by 140 children who spent the evening dancing, laughing and having a great time, as did the staff! The Easter bingo saw over 100 children dabbing furiously to win chocolate eggs and hampers. Thank you to all parents who have supported these events. Our next event is a Coronation picnic that is open to members of the community - this will be on Friday 5 May. Check our website for more details.

As always, we continue to be committed to giving children a wide variety of sporting opportunities, whatever their ability. Our Y5/6 athletes finished 4th in the whole of Lancaster and Morecambe, a great achievement given that we were the smallest school competing. We finished 3rd at the Carnforth tag rugby tournament and our Y3/4 and Y5/6 footballers played really well at the Lune Valley Cluster comp. We also attended competitive events for Y3,4,5,6 korfball where we took 3 teams to play. In school, we have held inter-house tournaments in dodgeball, cross country and korfball where all children get the chance to compete.

We held our own 'We are a Reader' day where children could come to school in pyjamas, with their teddy and favourite book. This enabled children to get involved without the stress of making costumes or the expense of buying them. Children split into groups of all age groups to carry out exciting activities about a range of books.

Outdoor ed continues to give additional opportunities to our children. Y3 have been canoeing on Borwick canal, Y6 have been abseiling and climbing (amazing) and YR, Y1 and Y2 have been on adventure scrambling walks in Halton, Silverdale and Warton. We continue to invest heavily in this area and are grateful to Phil Longbottom from BigAdventure for his continued excellence when delivering these sessions. They challenge our children to move out of their comfort zone, something we believe is important for life.

#### CATON PRIMARY SCHOOL

We had a very productive and enjoyable second half to the spring term with lots of great learning, enrichment and community involvement.

Our young scientists' curiosity was captured with some very exciting science learning. For science week, our Key Stage 2 children created some excellent seismometers and designed and made parachutes for eggs, applying their understanding of gravity and air resistance to ensure it was a safe flight. Reception Class had a very exciting end to their topic about animals with a trip to Blackpool Zoo. They also entertained us with their wonderful class assembly based on the novel 'Dear Zoo'.

#### COMMUNITY ORCHARD

You may have read in recent issues of The Link that the local B4RN volunteer group are providing funding for a Community Orchard scheme in our village. This will provide fruit and nuts for anyone in the village to harvest.

Representatives from the local B4RN volunteer group, Caton and Brookhouse Gardening Club, GrowCaton and Lachlan Rae Garden Management have been working with both the Parish and Lancashire County Council to agree how to go about bringing the idea to life and maintaining the trees in the future.

Three areas of land have been agreed which will fall into 2 phases.

Phase 1 - Fruit and Nut tree planting on Beckside and the grass area between Roman Crescent and Beckside. Beckside - Hazelnut and Walnut trees (dwarf variety) replacing trees removed due to Ash Dieback disease. Roman Way - Plum, Pear, Quince, Damson and Greengage trees

In both areas the varieties chosen will be easy to maintain and kept to a manageable height allowing the fruit to be harvested easily and without the use of ladders.

The grass in this area will continue to be mowed with a pathway mowed through the middle to allow access to the footpaths on either side. Fruit trees need annual pruning, and this will be undertaken by volunteers who have been coached in what is required for each tree.

Phase 2 - Fruit bushes on the spare land between the back gardens of houses on Fell View, Lesley Avenue and Copy Lane. This area will require preparation and planting will take place later in the year. We hope to be able to pick raspberries, blackcurrants, and other varieties next year and may also include some herbs and vegetables. When planting starts there will be very little disruption and noise so we hope that as "neighbours" of these areas you will not be adversely affected. Indeed, we very much hope you might choose to join in and help with the project.

#### CATON AND BROOKHOUSE GARDENING CLUB

Many thanks to the many members who came to the AGM last night. It is very gratifying for the committee to be supported in this way. We will continue to do our best to provide a nice programme and convivial events for you all to enjoy in 2023/24.

#### **GROW CATON**

The composting workshop last month was well attended and has inspired a number of people to composting more of their kitchen and garden waste. It was interesting to consider sharing a compost bin with neighbours for those who do not produce enough themselves. There is also scope to 'go big' and set up a community composting site. Support for this is available, it just takes volunteers to run it, could this be you? Notes from the talk will be made available in due course and if you have questions just ask us.

Spring is very slow this year, but our greenhouses and window sills are filling up with seedlings. We are looking for small pots (yoghurt/desert/etc pots) to use for sharing spare seedlings.
